



#### **Vaughan Williams at 150 – The Festival Celebrates!**

IIMF brings together Britten Sinfonia, one of the UK's most scintillating chamber ensembles, and RVW's former school Charterhouse, for a unique collaboration in celebration of the composer's 150th anniversary.

The magnificent Memorial Chapel provides the perfect backdrop for Ralph Vaughan Williams' beloved Fantasia on a Theme of Thomas Tallis; the world premiere of David Matthews' orchestral version of RVW's Romance & Pastorale; and the rarely performed Oxford Elegy, accompanied by the school's Chapel Choir. A hand-picked group of the school's finest string players also joins forces with the orchestra for the Fantasia and the St Paul Suite by RVW's great friend Holst.

Join our pre-concert reception in Hall to enjoy a glass of wine, a talk by Dr Russell Millard, Charterhouse's Head of Academic Music, about RVW's schooldays, and the rare opportunity to view RVW artefacts from the school's archive.



#### Guided Walk & RVW Talk with writer & broadcaster Richard Wigmore

RVW was a great walker – as a young man he would stroll from his home, Leith Hill Place, to nearby Coldharbour to practise on the organ in the church where his parents were married.

Follow in his footsteps with a guided walk around Leith Hill in the company of Richard Wigmore—distinguished musicologist, writer and expert lecturer for Martin Randall Travel tours—followed by a talk in the picturesque Christ Church introducing RVW's life, works and Surrey Hills connections.

Keen walkers are welcome to extend their outing after the talk with a further stroll down to Leith Hill Place to enjoy the glorious rhododendron woods, eat a picnic lunch and pay a visit to RVW's childhood home (subject to National Trust membership or separate ticket purchase - car parking is also available nearby).

#### **Pilgrims' Guided Walk & Young Artist Concert**

Our musical pilgrimage through the Surrey Hills began last season high up on the old Pilgrims' Way above Guildford and now moves on to Dorking, the town where Vaughan Williams spent much of his later life.

Take in the gorgeous views across Denbies' vineyard and Box Hill, home of George Meredith whose poem *The Lark Ascending* inspired RVW's great work of the same name, and enjoy a performance by gifted young musicians in the church nicknamed the 'Cathedral in the Woods'.

#### **The Lyrical Cello**

A very welcome return to the festival by acclaimed cellist Gary Hoffman, performing together with our own Festival Artistic Director Wu Qian!

Alongside gorgeously expressive works by Mendelssohn and Chopin, their programme celebrates the folk tradition which RVW worked tirelessly to preserve here in Surrey and beyond, and gives us a glimpse of what might have been through David Matthews' *Dark Pastoral* – a work built around the surviving fragment of the slow movement from Vaughan Williams' unfinished 1942 Cello Concerto.
